 you will contribute to this process.
- The ESPA programme welcomes applications from researchers from any country who can
 demonstrate their ability to generate world-class research contributing to ESPA's research
 agenda, as described in the <u>ESPA Knowledge Strategy</u>. You should read the call
 documentation before designing your research and completing this form.
- 3. All ESPA research grant applications are required to describe how ESPA research could be put into use to benefit the world's poor, who would use the research (both directly and indirectly) and what would need to be done to ensure that this research is put into use. You should read the ESPA Impact Strategy before designing your research and completing this application.
- 4. Applications must be submitted using the Arial font with a minimum size of 11pt.
- 5. CVs must be submitted using the ESPA Fellowship CV Template.
 - A CV will be required for the proposed Fellow, plus for each of the Fellow's proposed mentors
 - CVs must not exceed two pages in length.
- 6. Word and character limits indicated in this form will be strictly enforced and checked automatically on submission.
 - Any proposal that exceeds the word or character limits may be rejected before review.
- 7. The application must be submitted as a MS-Word document. Documents that have been converted to PDF format cannot be processed and may be rejected before review.
- 8. Please do not type information into parts of tables which have grey backgrounds. These sections will be ignored during processing.
- 9. Please do not add or delete rows in any of the sections of the forms.
